Registration

Registration is available online. Go to www.wcgoate.com, for all entry forms, venter forms, sponsor forms, directory advertisement, seminars, clinics, dinner social information.

All youth and adult exhibitors must fill out an entry forms for the shows that you will be entering. The Summary Registration forms are not used anymore, all that information has been placed on each entry forms. If you are only participating in the Youth Jackpot Prospect Market Goat Show, use the Youth Market Goat Entry Form only.

The General Event fee includes the seminars, dinner social and clinics. If you do not plan on attending these programs then this fee can be waived. At registration, dinner, tickets will be issued to those that paid the General Event fee. If you do not want to attend the seminars and/or clinics but would like to attend the dinner social, tickets can be purchased at the door for \$6.00 per person. General Rules of the Shows

1. All Extravaganza event programs are open to youth and adults, except the Jackpot shows, which are youth events.
2. Only does and wethers are eligible to be shown in the Showmanship and Jackpot Shows.
3. It is strongly recommended that all Jackpot Market goats be dehorned.
4. **Animals are not required to be clipped. Clipping is allowed in designated areas only.**
5. **Water must be available to goats in their pens at all times.**
6. **Meshed or plastic muzzles may be used so long as they allow the animal to open their mouth and drink water.**
7. For security purposes, buildings will be locked ½ hour after shows finish on Saturday night. They will be open the following morning at 6:30 a.m.
8. Weld County Goat Extravaganza is not responsible for any losses or accidents.
9. **Registration deadline is April 12, 2019. Late entries will be accepted with a late fee only.**
10. **Stalling - 6' x 6' pens are available to stall your animals. Initial bedding is not provided. Shavings and straw concessions provided. Exhibitors with smaller goats (especially young Pygmy goats & Nigerian Dwarfs) need to provide interior fencing or crates to keep goats from escaping pens.**
11. **No reserving pens in the livestock barn (Boer & Pygmy goats), all pens are first come-first serve!**
12. **No alcohol in the livestock barn at any time.**
13. No use of blowers allowed during the Showmanship Clinic, Saturday (9:00a-10:00a) or until finished.

Registrations with entry fees must be postmarked no later than April 12, 2019 to avoid late fees.

Health Requirements of the show

- No animals will be allowed on the fairgrounds exhibiting symptoms of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases such as but not limited to: external abscesses, ringworm, pinkeye, and soremouth. Market goats must be castrated or banded by the time of the vet check. It is recommended that goats be deloused two weeks prior to the Weld County Goat Extravaganza.
- **Health requirements for out-of-state exhibitors:** Colorado law requires all out of state goats be accompanied by a valid health certificate. Health certificates will be examined at time of check in. Must be issued by your veterinarian within 30 days of the WCGE show.
- **SCRAPIE:** The USDA's Scrapie Eradication Program will be enforced at the WCGE. All breeding goats; wethers

18 months & over; and all does shown as market goats must have scrapie ear tags. Exception: registered goats may use tattoos or microchips with breed registration numbers in place of scrapie ear tags. Registration papers must be provided for verification in the barn.

- **Vet checks will not occur this year at the 2019 WCGE.**
- WCGE Committee members reserve the right to request any animal to leave the premises of the WCGE if they feel an animal is unhealthy and does not meet the standards of the show as mentioned above. If that happens, **no refunds will be given.**

Event Information

- **Educational Seminars** will be given on Saturday. Presentations will be made upstairs in the 4-H Building, where the vendors and concessions are located.
- **Diseases associated with shows**—presented by Dr. JoAnn Bowen, DVM. We have all gone to shows and come home with issues that we did not plan on bringing home with us. Dr Bowen will give you some suggestions on what you can do.
- **Using goats to create firebreaks**—presented by Dianna Wilburn. Come see some great research on ways to use goats in a creative way to help create firebreaks around your property.
- **Goat death loss & the NAHMS Goat 2019 Study**—presented by Matt Branan. Information from the last goat and kid predator and nonpredator death loss study. It will show the overall picture of death loss, causes, costs, and mitigation measures for the U.S. Goat Industry.
- **Goat Nutrition**— presented by Steve Parks, Essentials Feeds. Come see some great information related to goat nutrition and see how your program might be improved.
- **Livestock Guardian Dogs (LGDs)** are some of the oldest breeds in existence and have been used for millennia as a cost effective, predator friendly method of protecting livestock from predation. In this informative talk, we will discuss everything the livestock producer needs to know to obtain, raise and utilize LGD. From choosing the best breed and breeder for the producer's individual needs, to introducing the puppy to livestock, to troubleshooting common struggles and issues, we will give you the necessary information to determine if LGDs are the correct choice for your needs. Whether you have two goats or two thousand, LGDs can be an invaluable tool to keep your pets and livelihood safe.
- **Showmanship Clinics**- Showmanship clinics provide instruction on showing and fitting for dairy and pygmy goat projects. **No market showmanship clinic will be given this year.** Hands-on practice with members and their goats will take place in the designated building, see schedule. Check the schedule of events for times.

Bring your animal and get some practical advice that will help you be successful in the show ring! **Blowers will not be allowed to be used when the showmanship clinic is going on, no exception. In the past it has been difficult to hear when the blowers are being used at the same time.**

- **Jackpot Showmanship Contests**—Youth exhibitors can test their skills in Jackpot Showmanship contests for market, dairy and pygmy divisions. Divisions are: Pre-Junior (8-9 years old); Junior (10-11); Intermediate (12-14); and Senior (15-18), age as of Dec. 31. Entry is \$5/member. You can pre-enter on the registration form, or you can register at show time. Cash premiums will be awarded. **All cash prizes must be picked up at the announcers table before the end of the show.** Market Champion showman will receive a buckle as well.

Pee Wee & Novice showmanship classes are also offered. There are no entry fees for these classes. They are intended to give young and first year members an opportunity to gain experience in the show ring. Ownership of the animal is not required for showmanship.

* If it is your first year in showmanship you can show in the novice class and your age group too.

- **Jackpot Prospect Market Goat Show:**
 - This is a prospect show. Animals must have milk teeth intact.
 - Goats will be weighed Sunday prior to the show and be divided into weight classes. **Weigh-in is 7:00-8:00 am only, no exceptions.**
 - Maximum weight is 70 lbs. Overweight animals can be shown but will not be considered for Division Champion or Grand Champion.
 - When posing the animal, all four feet must remain on the ground.
 - Premium payout is based on the jackpot system using \$5/entry and the following percentages: 1st - 35%, 2nd - 25%, 3rd - 20%, 4th - 12%, 5th - 8%. **All cash prizes must be picked up at the announcers table before the end of the show.**
 - Overall Grand Champion receives a buckle, rosette and \$150. Overall Reserve Grand Champion receives rosette and \$100.

Event Information (cont.)

- **Goat Shows**—The Boer, Dairy, and Pygmy shows are sanctioned by ABGA, ADGA, and NPGA respectively, and their rules shall govern.
Commercial (non-registered) classes are offered in the meat goat show.
The High Point champion in the ABGA shows must be entered in both shows (#1 & #2) to qualify for the High Point buckle. (If you are entered in only one show you will not qualify).

- **Premiums**—Premiums will be paid in the Boer and Dairy show A for 1st-5th placings (\$5, \$4, \$3, \$2, \$1). Premiums will be available after show has concluded. Premiums must be picked up at the show; they will not be mailed.
- **Dinner Social**—Be our guest at the dinner/social on Saturday, April 28th from 5:00 – 7:00 p.m. Come enjoy the food and camaraderie with other goat enthusiasts! This is included in your \$25.00 General Event fee or you can purchase tickets for \$6.00/person at the door. (The General fee includes up to 5 dinner tickets, if you need more than that just pay at the door). To help us plan accordingly, please indicate on the registration form the number of people from your family that will be attending.
- **Vendors**—Individuals and businesses will be exhibiting goat related items, services, and products during the Extravaganza. Plan to spend time visiting the vendor area in the 4-H Building.

Anyone interested in having a vendor space should contact Larry Hooker, 970-400-2093. Vendor space is limited and available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Cost for a single vendor space in 4-H building (approx. 10'x10') is \$85. See the Vendor form on the Website.

- **Goat Directory**—Here's a great opportunity to promote your business. Rates for ads are: \$35 business card; \$75 ½ page; and \$125 full page. Goat Directory Advertisement form is available on Website. Business card or ad must be included with the Goat Directory Advertisement form, in digital form. Payment should be included with your WCGE Advertisement form. All advertisement forms must be turned in by April 12, 2019 in order to get into the directory.
- **Award Sponsorship**- For \$35 you can sponsor one of the Champion awards being given at the WCGE. Sponsorships are on a first-come basis.
